We are definitely in better shape this year than last year. After all, last year at this time, we didn?t have any heat, or seats downstairs for that matter. We were still miles away from finishing. This was the lull before the storm, as after Thanksgiving, the work really went into high gear. As you recall we finished on time. It might have only been 45 minutes before opening, but it was on time!

The week the Shelby County Arts Fest is in downtown Shelbyville. The Strand will be open for tours during the festival. In the past the Arts Fest has taken place at Indiana Downs.
