Tonight Friday November 10, 2017 is the final movie in our 2017 Friday Night Frights series. This month we present the 1961 classic HORROR HOTEL. In this film a young coed goes to New England to write a paper on witchcraft. Her professor recommends that she spend her time in a small inn called the Raven's Inn. There, she notices some strange happenings. She then discovers she is marked for sacrifice. This presentation is 76 minutes long and starts at 7:30pm.

Next Friday November 17, 2017 we have something completely different! We will be showing CLASSIC CHRISTMAS CARTOONS after the Holiday Parade. The Parade starts at 7:00pm at the Porter Center. It should be over about 8pm. Maurice Finkel will have his calliope (weather permitting) in front of the Strand after the parade to play all your Holiday Favorites. Did you know we had a water tower? Volunteer Bob S. has it planned. He said it won't be hard, just time consuming. When that piece of machinery is removed, we can then place our new (to us) stage lighting dimmer rack in the same location.

We are in the home stretch of our season. Tonight will be our 80th performance of the 2017 season, with about 20 to go. This is all because of you, Thank You. See you at the Strand!
